



IUSM Campus Scholarships

Below is a listing of the scholarships that pertain specifically to those campuses indicated. In addition to the general IUSM scholarships through the Indianapolis campus, these campuses have developed their own scholarship programs that benefit their specific medical student populations. For the most part, there are no additional applications for these scholarships since the individual campuses consider all of their medical students for the scholarships listed. If eligible or selected to receive any of these scholarships, the campus notifies the student directly.

Bloomington Medical Sciences Program

Dr. Anthony Pizzo Scholarship

Entering first year student nominees attending the Bloomington Medical Science Program are notified in July or August to complete a candidate application. A Bloomington Medical Sciences Program Scholarship Committee composed of Center Faculty, Center Administrators and Community Leaders associated with the Program interviews applicants. A recipient is selected on the basis of academic excellence, financial need and other criteria as well as upholds the ideals of Dr. Pizzo. The award amount is \$5,000 and is renewable in the student's second year.

Bloomington Medical Sciences Program Scholarships

Recipients may be awarded up to \$2,500 based on their academic performance (financial need may be a consideration) after the first year at the Bloomington Medical Sciences Program. The academic performance will be given first preference.

The IUSM-Evansville Scholarship Committee selects recipients from the incoming first year class. The candidates must be residents of southwest Indiana (the exception being the Evansville Surgical Associates Scholarship, which carries no restrictions), attend the IUSM-Evansville campus and shows evidence of academic achievement by competitive GPA, MCAT and outside activities. All of the above scholarships are renewable for the second year at IUSM-Evansville given satisfactory academic performance in the first year. The scholarship amounts range from \$2,000 to \$5,000 for two years while attending the Campus.

The Aline Mary Aust Condict and Charles H. Aust, Sr., M.D., Scholarship

The IUSM-Evansville Scholarship Committee selects the recipient for this scholarship based on the student's integrity, financial need, and academic achievement. Special consideration will be given to rural students as well as University of Evansville Alumni. Residents from Warrick, Vigo and Allen Counties or their respective contiguous Indiana counties will be given first preference. Other preferences are set in the event there are no qualified candidates from the above Indiana counties. This scholarship is renewable for all four years of medical school. The amount is \$5,000.

The Indiana State Medical Association First District Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to an outstanding student at the end of the second year for use in the third year.

Dr. Justice F. Wynn Scholarships

Preference is given to students from Vanderburgh County (Indiana). Awards determined by the IUSM-Evansville Scholarship Committee.

Unless stated in the descriptions above, all above scholarships require that we have your parental data on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA on the Web). This is to determine a student's financial need for consideration. For entering first year students, the academic information used will be pulled from that submitted as part of your IU School of Medicine Admissions application and most current MCAT scores. You will need to make sure to submit the FAFSA on the Web by no later than May 31, 2007 and the IU School of Medicine Application for Financial

Assistance by May 31, 2008 to be considered for the above scholarships as well as any other IU School of Medicine general scholarships.
